

The 13 Colonies







Three Types of Colonies



I. Royal Colonies - Royal colonies were owned directly by the king.



• A. These governments were appointed by the Crown, and carried out the orders and wishes of the Crown as opposed to private or local interests



 B. Virginia, Carolinas, Massachusetts, New Jersey, New Hampshire, and New York.











ROYAL COLONY

LAND OWNERSHIP

- colonists allowed to own and sell more land
- large plantations farms with slave labor
 - social classes developed
- border of Georgia increased south to St. Mary's River and west to Mississippi River

SLAVERY

- only wealthy could own slaves
 - worked on rice plantations
- planters bought more and more land
- changed the economy of Georgia
 grew rich
- slaves were property and had no rights

GOVERNMENT

- Royal governors appointed by King
 - Trustee laws repealed
 - bi-cameral legislature
- white males with property could vote
- colonists had more freedom: self-government
 - court system to settle disputes









II. Proprietary Colonies


A. An individual, or small elite group, essentially own the colony, controlling all of the actions and institutions of government.

B. The governors of the proprietary colonies reported directly to the king.

• C. Rhode Island, Connecticut, and The Massachusetts Bay Colony were Charter colonies.

Geography and Economy



I. New England Colonies

A. Long winters, and rocky terrains - forest and oceans provided avenues for the colonists living in this region to make a living by fishing, hunting, and ship building.






















B. A lot of these settlers came to find religious freedoms.

2. Colonists were expected to abide by religious expectations, or they risked being exiled.
















THE THI3TEEN, COLONIES

- C. Salem Witch Trials February 1692 through May 1693.
- 1. Witchcraft paranoia came with the colonists from England to the New World.
- 2. The devil's practice of giving humans (witches) the power to harm others in return for their loyalty—had emerged in Europe and was widespread in colonial New England.

- 3. Puritan leaders felt colonists were being punished with witchcraft presence due to abandoning their religious roots.
- 4. More than 100 people were tried, and 20 were put to death.

- D. Social Colonists lived in close proximity.
- 1. Town Meetings Important to running local communities.

II. Middle Colonies

- A. States New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, and Delaware
- B. Geography/ Resources Good farmland, timber, furs and coal. Iron ore was a particularly important natural resource.
- 1. Known as the "Breadbasket" of colonial America due to the large amount of grains produced.
