B. Paul left school at 13 to apprentice for his father.


- 1. His father was a silversmith.
- 2. He died before Paul was legally old enough to take over his shop.






C. In 1756 he left Boston and joined the army to fight in the French and Indian War.

• - He was a part of a failed attempt to take a French fort, Crown Point.











A. Revere participated with Samuel Adams as a courier and an engraver of propaganda materials.
